

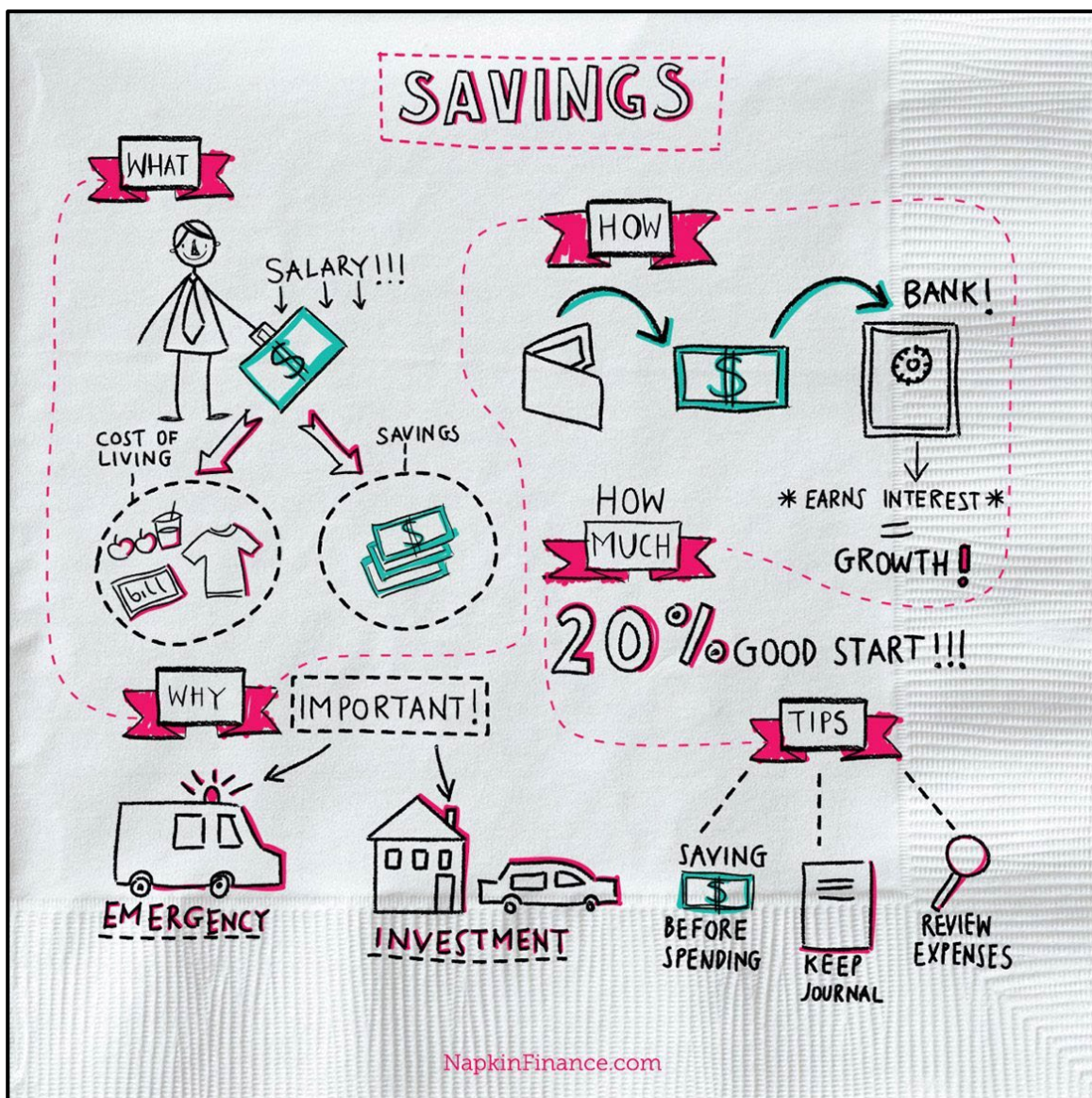
Distance Learning for Middle School Social Studies
